Agreeable to the desire of the Libertador and in conformity with the conversation which passed between Your Excellency and myself on Saturday I now beg leave to transmit annexed my proposals for supplying the Ten Millions of Dollars wanted for the service of the Republic. I hope the terms will meet your approbation and be approved of by the Libertador if so. I shall set off immediately for London with any gentleman the Government may think proper to appoint to accompany me for the purpose of carrying the contract into effect and to receive the amount of the Loan. — I anxiously wait your reply. and have the honor to remain

Particulars of Contract for Ten Millions of Dollars<sup>2</sup> offered  
to the Republic of Peru by Maxwell Hyslop Esquire  
Merchant Great Saint Helens London

Article 1 Ten Millions of Dollars at the rate of 82 per Cent. -

" 2<sup>d</sup> The said Maxwell Hyslop shall faithfully pay the  
Republic of Peru the sum of £82 Sterling for every Bond  
of One Hundred Pounds Sterling. -

" 3<sup>d</sup> Bonds for One Hundred Pounds Sterling to be issued  
each to bear interest of Six Pounds per Cent per Annum  
to be paid in London half Yearly. -

" 4<sup>th</sup> The sum of Ten Millions of Dollars to be paid  
by the said Maxwell Hyslop London in manner  
as follows - say

15 per Cent to be paid immediately on completion  
of the Contract

15 per Cent payable at the end of three months

12 per Cent payable at the end of two months  
and the remaining payments of

10 per Cent payable monthly. - The whole  
Amount of the Loan would consequently be  
paid up in nine months from the date  
of Contract. -

" 5<sup>th</sup> The above payments to be lodged by the said  
Maxwell Hyslop into the hands of the Peruvian  
Commissioner duly authorised by the Republic to  
receive the same. -

Article 6<sup>th</sup> The said Marcell Nyslop to be allowed  
£3 per Cent upon the Sterling Amount for his trouble  
in collecting and remitting the instalments and to  
cover all expences and incidental charges incurred  
thereon; —

" 7<sup>th</sup> The amount necessary for paying the two first  
half yearly dividends to be left in the hands of  
Marcell Nyslop, or deposited in any Bank, and  
to be applied by the said Marcell Nyslop for  
the express purpose of paying the first and second  
Dividends. —
