 section is devoted to the zoology and
 botany of the country, and the twenty-
 second to its astronomy and
 meteorology. The twenty-third section
 is devoted to the medicine and
 surgery of the country, and the twenty-
 fourth to its law and jurisprudence. The
 twenty-fifth section is devoted to the
 philosophy and metaphysics of the
 country, and the twenty-sixth to its
 logic and rhetoric. The twenty-seventh
 section is devoted to the mathematics
 and physics of the country, and the
 twenty-eighth to its chemistry and
 astronomy. The twenty-ninth section
