It was my intention yesterday to have done myself the honor of waiting on your Excellency to day in person, to have thanked your Excellency both in the name of my Government, and in my own name, for your attentions in ordering His Britannic Majesty's Ship Cherub, under my Command, to be supplied with the necessary Stores and Provisions that we stood in need of so expeditiously; but having made some little exertions yesterday, I found last night my wounds so swollen, and so painful this morning, that I am afraid, that if I venture another journey to the City, that it will be the means of protracting my cure, and keeping me a longer time a Prisoner in my Cabin; I must therefore beg that your  
Excellency

Excellency will have the goodness to dispense  
with (in my opinion) so essential a part of  
my duty, as my personal attendance on your  
Excellency before I sail this evening, and  
that your Excellency will be assured that  
I am,
